Curricular Updates per Karen Noel:

Potential Pilot

- Currently using CKLA K-3, Units of Study 4, Global Issues 5-6
- Data, interventions have driven the exploration of different curriculum possibilities
- Looked to workshop approach models, specifically Fountas and Pinnell Classroom
- F&P Classroom model has been around for 20 years
- Currently using F&P interventions (Leveled Literacy Intervention) at district, Foster
- F&P Classroom uses Mini lessons, Interactive Read Alouds, Independent Reading, Shared Reading, Guided Reading, Book Clubs, Phonics (kit includes materials)
- Themes supported in program includes diversity, character development (similar to global leader/PBIS)
- Asked that there be at least 1 pilot class at each grade level for 20-21 school year
- K-3 would look at full program, 4th-6th may keep with workshop (Units of Study) and add in parts of F&P to enrich current practice

Visit outside of district to see F&P Classroom in Action

- Foster Admin staff visited Hortonville schools-watched 1st grade class, talked to team and literacy coach
- Hortonville staff likes materials, saw students being independent with own reading
- Data monitoring very comprehensive and showing progress throughout the year on trend lines
- Social Studies curriculum has shifted to overarching inquiry/discourse, not facts

- Meet w/ programs & services after March to show progress and include data/rationale
